Hoist Training

Course Duration	Half Day (This course includes a practical session) Delegates MUST be able to partake in the practical aspect of the course. Safety footwear must be worn. NB Attendance Certificates will not be issued to delegates who do not comply with PPE requirements.
Who will Benefit	Everyone who has the potential to use a hoist to transfer the patient, either in a residential setting or in the community.

Course Objectives	To ensure that delegates have a thorough knowledge of the hazards posed by all manual handling activities To ensure all delegates understand the reasons for manual handling regulations. To ensure all delegates are shown the correct method of lifting/moving objects relevant to their work activity
Maximum Number of Delegates	10 -15 depending upon room size

Premises need to have a mains electricity supply, comfortable seating for all delegates, and suitable area for the practical session and unless agreed differently, to provide a hoist.
